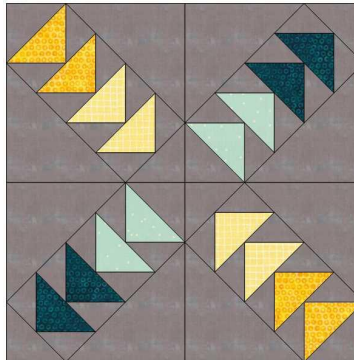


Fabulous Flying Geese

We will use foundation paper piecing to construct these blocks. You can review my tips for paper piecing at www.youtube.com/TrueBlueQuilts



Decide how many units you would like to make, and print additional copies of the foundation pattern for each unit. Foundation pattern is a separate file, called "FPP-Geese-pattern".

One block finishes at 8", or put four together as shown for a 16" block.

Cutting

Size, color	Number for ONE unit	For FOUR units
Background squares, 5" (for pieces A1 and A14)	1, cut once on diagonal	4, cut once on diagonal
background rectangles, 3-1/4" x 2" (for pieces A3, 4, 6, 7, 9, 10, 12, 13)	8	32
Background squares, 6-1/2" for side triangles	1, cut once on diagonal	4, cut once on diagonal
Assorted colors - main triangles, 3" x 5" (for pieces A2, 5, 8, 11)	4, can be one fabric or many	16, can be one fabric or many

Following the numbered sections on the foundation pattern, assemble the center of the geese unit using the background rectangles and 5" squares, along with the accent colors. Add the background side triangles. Trim the final unit to 8-1/2".

Optional: arrange 4 units to form an "X" block. Trim to 16-1/2".
